The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. A quorum was established and President Lloyd reviewed the proposed agenda.

Devotions: Dallas gave devotions relating to upcoming Palm Sunday. He spoke on humility and how to be true followers of Christ we must serve others. Humble yourselves in the sight of the Lord and He shall lift you up.

Trustee's Report: Harden stated that the HVAC work is going well. They are going at a good pace and keeping the church very clean as they go. He asked if the work would be done by Memorial Day but they cannot promise that at this time due to having to run pipes an alternate way other than was planned because of the walls. We will continue to plan to have worship service in the sanctuary the next two Sundays.

Harden will be taking care of some bolts found in the sanctuary that may cause safety issue.

Bennie is working on speakers in nursery.

Secretary's Report: Dallas is not receiving copies of minutes. Gloria is to email Linda to make her aware of this and Dallas is to check his spam folder. A motion was made and seconded to accept the March minutes as written. The motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Becky reported the March treasurer's report as follows:

The General Fund balance at the end of February totaled \$9786.22. This reflects a negative balance.

General fund receipts for March totaled \$15052.34

General fund disbursements for March were \$18469.16

The General Fund balance at the end of March was \$13203.04.

This also reflects a negative balance.

Treasurers also reported that it was decided they want financial reports in July and January instead of quarterly. Consistory agreed for semi-annually. A motion was made and seconded to approve. The motion carried.

Becky reported that the cemetery fund awarded the mowing contract.

Becky and Cathy presented financial reports to be presented to the Sunday School Classes as part of the Stewardship Committee. After they were reviewed by the members it was decided some adjustments needed to be made before presenting to the classes.

Stewardship: Gloria reported Harden Phipps made his presentation to the committee on doing the tractor pull fundraiser but the committee decided not to do one at this time due to lack of time to adequately prepare.

Also to date we had sold \$361 worth of the knives that were donated to us.

Gloria reported that they still have not gotten sponsors for each backpack. Consistory expressed concern that they thought this would have been reached by now but Gloria explained that several people have expressed interest in sponsoring but the donations have not been received yet. The next bagging will be April 19 and is open to volunteers now. It is at 9am. She has marked on calendar but will lift up in the announcements closer to the time. Also they are working on refurbishing the old signs. Saving money by sanding down and repainting and then having Cornerstone Graphics re-letter. It will advertise the 24 hour drop box and that we take items for Meals4kids and Greensboro Urban Ministry. The cost of the signs will be covered by donation.

Pastor's Report: Rev. Spencer reported we will be having special services for the week of Easter. Thursday April 17, Friday April 18, Sunday April 20 Sunrise Service at 7am, breakfast at 8am and worship 11am. After Easter he would like his sermons to be related to the 7 weeks of the special study he just concluded. He is concerned for Christianity today and after reading I Refuse To Lead A Dying Church and We Refuse To Lead A Dying Church, he felt he needed to do a study with church members. They took scriptures and saw how they used the scriptures to help save their church.

Sixteen churches that had to make some hard decisions. He wants to use the scriptures in his sermons and after the series of sermons get the group back together with anyone else that wants to meet.

Supper Committee: Cliff reported the results of the soup sales \$608.00. There is BBQ left to sell from the supper. Meals4kids and Alzheimer's Research will receive \$597.96 from the March Supper. The profit was \$7972.80. The balance of the supper CD is \$14078.98 and the checking At account is \$18604.62. the November congregational meeting it was decided that we would pay for the van out of the CD and the balance we would put in replacement fund in parsonage. Cliff presented graphics for lettering the van with our church name on it so we will be recognized when it is out on the road. A motion was made and seconded to approve putting the sign on the van. The motion was carried.

Cliff also reported on the Fellowship Committee's upcoming event on May 17th, at Hagan Stone Park and they are putting together a flyer.

Pastoral Committee: Dallas reported the committee has been formed but they have not met yet. Lloyd will make an announcement Sunday letting the congregation know about the committee and who is on it. If any members or Rev. Spencer have any concerns, they can go to anyone on this committee. The members are Carmen Cox, Dee Greeson, Bob Hamlet, Joe Hughes, Sonia Knowles, and Linda Shue.

Andy Open: Dallas said the profits from this year's Andy Open will go to the General Fund, the Youth, and the Community Resource Fund. He encouraged everyone to get golfers to participate and get donors. They also decided this year to give the golfers the sodas but will continue to sell snacks. They need homemade cookies and desserts for lunch.

Other Business: Lloyd Gilliam reported that Sharon Moore and Dee Greeson have agreed to begin after Easter making sure the Sunday School teachers are complying with the safe church policy.





As you know, our EOG testing will begin in just under a month. On behalf of the Bears team, I'd like to ask you to consider volunteering as a


proctor for one of the testing days. I know giving up half a day in the middle of the week is simply not possible for some due to work and family obligations, but if there is any way you could assist the school in this way or recruit someone who can, we would love to hear from you.

Unfortunately, we just can't have test groups without proctors. Almost every teacher in the school is responsible for administering a test each day during the testing window, so we must rely almost entirely on community volunteers to proctor. The largest number of volunteers will be needed on June 3 and June 4. We'll take parents, grandparents, older siblings, cousins, neighbors — just about anyone! Proctors must be at least 18 years old and can't be students at a GCS school. Those are the only requirements.

All you need to do is reply by email with the date(s) you are able to volunteer, and I will forward your contact information to the testing coordinator. Should you volunteer, you will not be assigned to a test group that contains your child or a relative.


