Consistory Meeting Minutes
January 10, 2013

Members Present: Sharon Moore, Linda Ayers, Bennie Gerner, Lloyd Gilliam, Cathy Gossett, Dee Greeson, Clifton Greeson, Bob Hamlet, Joe Hughes, Cheryl Royal, Becky Stafford

Trustees: Wesley Reece

Pastor: Rev. Lloyd Spencer

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m.

Sharon thanked the consistory for their faith in her to lead the consistory and that she very much wants the consistory to be a team.

Devotional: Rev. Spencer read from the “book of Linus” (Peanuts cartoon character) relating the message that good theology has a way of taking a load off your mind. He followed the reading with prayer.

A quorum of members was declared and Sharon reviewed the proposed agenda.

Updates/Received Correspondence:

- Sharon read a letter from Brenda Currie thanking the Consistory for the Christmas gift.
- Sharon approved the purchase of a new recycling can.
- A locksmith was required to unlock the old filing cabinet currently being utilized in the church office. A replacement will need to be purchased or donated if a lock cannot be secured.
- Bob Hamlet may be able to secure a fireproof safe. Bill and Clifton will work with Bob on this and if unable to secure this safe, they will repair the old one or purchase a new one.

Trustees Report:

- Harden will change the lock to the office door. Shirley will develop a form for people to sign if they are issued a key. Changing locks on all doors will be considered at a later time.
- The outside door of the education building on the Old Julian Road side has been pressure washed. June Clapp will prime and paint the door.
- The thermostat guard in the old fellowship hall will be replaced.
- Parts to repair the columns at the front of the church will be delivered in 10 days.

- A work day is scheduled for Saturday, February 16 beginning at 8:00 a.m. Work to be completed: paint new kitchen, clean and replace bulbs in the sanctuary, strip, wax, and buff floor in the new fellowship hall.
- Sharon has received notice that the company who has been doing our water testing will no longer be able to offer this service. They have made recommendation of other companies we may contact for this service. Trustees will make sure the first quarter testing was done and will secure a new company for the next scheduled testing due in April.
- New air conditioning unit for the 2nd floor needs to be replaced. Bob will work with the Building and Maintenance Committee to consider if we should replace the unit with another oil unit or with a heat pump. They will then report their findings to the consistory.

Pastor’s Report:

- The confirmation class of eight is going well.
- Rev. Spencer expressed appreciation from himself and Gussie for the Christmas gift.
- We gained more members than we lost in 2012.
- Since Rev. Spencer has been at Mt. Hope, there have been 41 new members, 7 transferred out, and 53 deaths.
- Trevor Bolton and Jessica Bazen will join Mt. Hope this Sunday.
- The Fellowship Ministry Team has already met this year. Participation in the ministry teams is good and Rev. Spencer is looking forward to a good year. Rev. Spencer and Sharon plan to meet with each ministry team.
- Sharon, Rev. Spencer, and Shirley will now be using an electronic calendar through Outlook. The trustees and Barbara Greeson of the Communication Ministry Team also have access to this calendar.
- 2013 Communion Schedule:
 - Sunday, February 24
 - Thursday, March 28 – Maundy Thursday
 - Sunday, June 16

 - Sunday, October 6 – World Communion Day

Treasurer’s Report: Joe Hughes presented the December, 2012 treasurer’s report as follows:

- General fund beginning balance: (\$3,018.20)
This reflects a negative balance.
- General fund receipts: \$26,287.32
- General fund disbursements: \$24,851.15
- General fund ending balance: (\$700.33) This reflects a negative balance.

The total ending balance reflects the money collected for the windows under General Giving Fund: Misc. but is not reflected in the General Fund Balance. A separate fund for the windows will be set up.

A motion was made and seconded to accept the December, 2012 treasurer's report as presented. The motion carried.

It was noted that there are financial accounts that we do not know about and we need to locate them. The treasurer and assistant treasurers are assigned the task of finding these accounts, find out their purpose, the person who is authorized to sign checks from these accounts, the bank used, and the balance. Sharon stated we need to know where our resources are and utilize them for a common goal. Per the church constitution, all groups and committees are to make an annual report to the consistory which shall include how they have utilized their finances.

Secretary's Report: A motion was made and seconded to approve the December, 2012 minutes as written. The motion carried.

Committee Reports:

Stained Glass Windows – Bennie Gerner

- Deposit of 35% of the window cost was made on Monday to Salem Stained Glass.
- Committee will go to the factory to select medallions and then they will approve the glass layout.
- In April or by May 1, the windows will be ready to install, installation will take one week.
- Music and Worship Ministry Team will coordinate a dedication program for the windows as a part of our Memorial Day service scheduled for May 19.

Safe Church Policy – Dee Greeson

- Criminal background checks are complete on almost all youth leaders.
- Consistory members turned in their background check consent forms tonight.

- Bill Craft has been working with wireless internet connections to give us the capability to do group abuse prevention training for youth leaders.
- Committee is continuing to work on actual policy.
- Verified insurance coverage for sexual misconduct claims.

Continuing Business:

- Table van usage until future date.
- Table church utilization until future date.

These two topics will be discussed as they pertain to the collaborated mission of Mt. Hope UCC.

New Business:

- Sharon read 10 characteristics of good leaders and related these to the Bible and to Jesus as the greatest leader ever. In performing our duties as members of the consistory team we should ask ourselves "What would Jesus do as a leader?"
- Each consistory member shared their goals/priorities and visions. Sharon will take our written goals/priorities and visions and match them to the ones of the different committees to develop a plan or approach to a common goal.
- Sharon stated we must operate under the rules of our church constitution. Bennie and Rev. Spencer will put together a task force to review the constitution as mandated every five years.
- Rev. Spencer will make announcements on Sunday mornings.

Sharon reviewed items covered at this meeting.

Since the second Thursday in February is Valentine's Day, our next meeting will be on Thursday, February 7. Items for the meeting agenda should be forwarded to Sharon by 5:00 p.m., February 1.

Rev. Spencer closed the meeting with prayer.

The meeting adjourned at 9:15 p.m.

When our Friends & Neighbors group planned our February meeting, we wanted to share something that involved Easter or the Lent season. *Our State Magazine* introduced us to the "egg church," the First Presbyterian Church in Kernersville who plans to make and sell 100,000 chocolate eggs this year. So we located the church and planned a visit to them. They have a whole team of people who work on the eggs three days a week for eight weeks before Easter. Some of the people belong to the church, but many don't. They used this project to

pay off their mortgage and now to support out-reach ministries. Everyone was working on the eggs when we arrived. There were coconut and peanut butter chocolate-covered eggs everywhere. The chocolate aroma and the people there were very inviting. They had a tour guide who explained the different processes, and allowed us to taste test the eggs. Some of us even bought a few eggs to bring back home. Once the morning work on the eggs was complete, all work stopped, and the pastor led the group in a Lent devotion. He said they share a devotion every day that they work on the eggs so they don't lose focus of what Easter is really about, the life, death, and resurrection of Christ. He encouraged all of us to remember that this time of year is not only about peanut butter, coconut and chocolate, but also about drawing closer to Christ during Lent.

If you would like to learn more about the "egg" church, check out their web site at www.FPCKernersville.org. After leaving the church, we stopped at Captain Tom's Seafood in Kernersville and enjoyed sharing lunch as a group before returning home.






Greensboro Urban Ministry:



The Social Concerns Ministry Team needs your help with an up-coming project for our military families: Our Team is planning a campaign to help in supporting the Ft. Bragg Fisher House Foundation. Since 1990 the Fisher House Foundation has

been serving military families during times of medical crises. These comfort homes are built by the foundation and given as gifts to the military services and Veterans Administration.

The Ft. Bragg Fisher House is one of 57 existing Fisher Houses. They anticipate receiving a larger facility in the near future which will be located on the hospital grounds. The Fisher House is a comfortable temporary home, filled with warm, caring people who help family members endure the stresses associated with a loved one's condition. Charitable contributions are an important source of funding for Army Fisher Houses. All donations are tax deductible and a Tax ID number will be provided upon request.

What is Needed?

About the Fisher Houses: Typically, the houses are 5,000 to 16,800 square feet homes by the Fisher family and Fisher House Foundation. Each house is designed to provide 8 to 21 suites. All are professionally furnished and decorated in the tone and style of the region. The houses can accommodate 16 to 42 family members. They feature a common kitchen, laundry facilities, spacious dining room and an inviting living room with library and toys for children. The newest houses are 100% handicap accessible and include elevators. A Fisher House is a temporary residence and is not a treatment facility, hospice or counseling center. The program began in 1990 and has offered more than 3 million days of lodging to more than 160,000 families. The Fisher House Foundation is a not-for-profit organization that builds new houses and assists in the coordination of private support and encourages public support for homes. Eligibility criteria are established locally by hospitals or installation commanders. Families do not pay to stay at a Fisher House. Fees at Army, Navy and Air Force Fisher Houses are underwritten by the Fisher House Foundation. Fisher Houses have full time salaried managers, but depend on volunteers and volunteer support to enhance daily operations and program expansion. Up to 2011: More than 160,000 families have been served, over 4 million days of lodging have been offered, families have saved more than \$192 million in lodging and transportation costs, and volunteers have donated more than 70,000 hours per year serving military families.

What can our Church do?

- Donate items that are needed (we are working on getting a box ready to place in the Breezeway for the items you bring).
- You can help put the items in packets to be delivered to the families.

- You can write notes of encouragement to go to the families that will receive the packets.
- At a later date we would like to go down to Ft. Bragg and help with some of the volunteer work and deliver the packets.

We would definitely appreciate any help that you can give toward this project. We will be getting more information to you at a later date.
