Facing the possibility of knee replacement surgery got me thinking. In 1990 when I had my first knee surgery I remember the situation very well. With the pain I was experiencing then and the pain that I'm experiencing now, anything would be better. You go into the hospital, someone puts a little mask over your face, and the next thing you know you wake up with the pain all gone.

Wouldn't it be great if life were like that? If we could just go to sleep and wake up with all our hurts and pain, our trials and tribulations all gone. It would be so nice just to close our eyes for awhile and wake up with everything OK.

I learned another lesson from that experience though. The surgery was over. The pain was gone.....until the anesthetic wore off. It was then that I found out that for healing to take place the pain might be more severe for a while. In order for my knee to get better I would have to put up with some pain and some restrictions for a while.

That, my friends, is life! No matter what we're going through, sometimes things have to hurt more for a while in order to make them better. Sometimes we have to change what we do and the way we do them in order to allow healing to take place.

It's going to be another six weeks before I know whether I'll be having knee replacement surgery or not, but the lessons have already been learned. I'm ready to do what I need to do to allow healing to take place. As we deal with the hurts, pains, and disappointments that are a reality in life, maybe we need to remember those lessons from surgery. Doing something is better than doing nothing, sometimes it might hurt a lot more before it gets better, but true healing is well worth the effort.

The meeting was called to order at 7:10 p.m. A quorum was established and President Lloyd reviewed the proposed agenda.

**Devotions:** Pastor Lloyd Spencer spoke on change and used an illustration of the book “A Visit to Grandma’s.” He pointed out that sometimes there is not much we can do when it occurs; change is going to happen and it can be for the better. We need to be open to things around us changing.

**Youth Report– Sharon Moore:** Sharon stated that she is excited about the direction and changes for the Youth. She presented handouts of the Youth Planning Format and Program Structure and stated that this will give each individual an opportunity to develop his or her own activities. Youth Planning Meetings will be held the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday and the 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday of each month the Youth will conduct the worship service.

**Secretary’s Report:** It was noted by Dallas Belvin that Walnut Wood Golf Course was misspelled in the section of the Andy Open Golf Tournament. After the correction was made; a motion was made and seconded to accept the February minutes as written. The motion carried.

**Trustee’s Report: Harden**

- Harden Phipps reported that Jim Fields of Mechanical Heating and Air expects to start installation of heating system the Monday after the BBQ & Chicken Pie Supper.
- It was announced that the new heating and cooling unit in Shirley’s office had been replaced and was donated by Kay Heating and Air by Bob Hamlett.
- Harden presented a fund raising proposal for a tractor pull with profits to benefit the FFA Scholarship fund to rising seniors at Southeast High School. After discussions consistory members decided to refer this to the Stewardship Committee which will meet March 25, 2014.

**Pastor’s Report:**

- Pastor Lloyd stated that the ministry teams are in full swing and the ladies study group is going well.
- The Sunday evening classes on “Where We’ve Been and Where We’re Going” continue to be very thought-provoking.
- Pastor Lloyd went over the plans for the upcoming April schedule. *Maundy Thursday Service will be Thursday, April 13<sup>th</sup> at 7 p.m. Good Friday Service is scheduled April 18<sup>th</sup> at 7 p.m. with Easter being April 20<sup>th</sup>. Easter Sunrise Service will be at 6:30 a.m. with breakfast to follow in the Fellowship Hall.*

**Treasurer’s Report:** Bill reported the February treasurer’s report as follows:

- General fund receipts for February totaled \$12,325.08
- General fund disbursements for budgeted items for February were \$12,134.24
- Disbursements for non-budgeted items totaled \$1,700.99
- The General Fund balance at the end of February was (\$9,786.22) This also reflects a negative balance.

Major expenses (\$1000 or more) in February included fuel and power, and February salaries and benefits. A total of \$639.39 was also paid to programs benefitting Mount Hope youth, those in need, and for educational and study activities. A motion was made and seconded to accept the February treasurer’s report as presented. The motion carried.

**Committee Reports:**

**Stewardship Committee – Bill Craft and Cathy Gossett:**

Cathy Gossett gave an overview with handout of Mt. Hope’s tax exempt status and the regulations governing tax exempt 501(C)(3) organizations’ benefits and responsibilities under the federal tax available from the IRS. Our policy is to make this presentation annually to avoid any activities which could compromise our tax exempt status.

**Meals 4 Kids – Gloria Apple:** Gloria stated that she was getting more sponsors to the program. She reported that people were still using the drop box for donations. The committee is working on redoing the signs advertising the 24 hour drop box.

They will put a note in the newsletter to get the word out that the donations collected will be used for Meals4kids and Greensboro Urban Ministry. Gloria noted the ARK project was going well and stated that each project is different and requires different skills.

### Continuing Business: Clifton & Dallas

Clifton Greeson noted that BBQ & Chicken Pie Supper is scheduled for March 23, 2014.

Dallas Belvin informed the consistory plans for the Andy Open scheduled May 31<sup>st</sup> at Walnut Wood Golf Course were going well.

Closing Prayer by Rev. Lloyd Spencer

The meeting adjourned at 8:50 p.m.

The Consistory reconvened at 8:55 p.m.

The Consistory discussed Pastor Lloyd's benefits package. Since Lloyd is on Medicare to date he asked if the Consistory would approve paying for the Medicare insurance premium instead of his regular premium policy. This will result in a net savings for Mount Hope. A motion was made to approve. The motion carried.

Discussion centered around a Pastoral Relations Committee and if we had one fully functioning. A motion was made to get the Pastoral Relations Committee formed.

Seagrove is the largest community of potters with the longest continual history of pottery making in the United States. The bridge, originally built in 1911 at a cost of \$40, was refurbished in 1999 to help preserve it.


