### Love Letter from Your Pastor: The Wind's Song

The wind was annoying. For the first part of my life, I didn't much care for the wind. The wind messed up my hair; as an asthmatic child with seasonal allergies, the wind stirred up too much pollen and often hemmed me up inside while the wind was outside dancing a fine jig through the trees. It made me mad. Until one day, while living 3000 miles away from home in a place where only a few people knew my first name, the wind ushered in the holy.

The coffee shop where I worked was a mile and half from my home. I know you hear old stories about walking up hills both ways to school, but I promise you the Berkeley hills made those stories pale in comparison. It was hilly and on this day when I was walking to work at 5:45 am to open up the shop, it was windy. There was yet no sun popping up on the horizon for the day was too young, but the wind blowing off the Pacific was in full force.

I was glad to be on my way to work at such an hour. It was my brother's birthday and this day had been sad for me since his death. I was thankful for the distraction of work and the company that the barista and all the customers would offer me while at work. Prepared to be angry at the wind for messing up my hair or blowing allergens up my nose, or, I don't know I probably was even subconsciously blaming the wind for my grief, I trudged up the hill with my belongings for the day strapped to my back. Much to my surprise, I didn't get angry, I laughed. At that time of the morning, the neighbors, had they seen me, might have assumed I was coming down off of a very interesting night. I was not chuckling or smiling a crooked grin, I was laughing the kind of laughter that invited your whole body to

participate, even the parts that needed to heal and the broken parts that needed to be made whole.

The wind blew and I didn't get angry, I laughed. The day of Pentecost is described as the day when a rush of wind blew through the streets. I wonder if it was like the wind that nearly knocked me off my feet that day on my way to work, not because of its forceful gales, but because of its power. The power of the Holy Spirit that can transform anger into pure joy.

During Pentecost (which is the longest season of the church year, running from 50 days after Easter to the last Sunday in November) we will be singing a new song during worship called, The Wind Song written by Swee Hong Lim and Shirley Erena Murray. You may have already heard Ray Mims sing it for us during Communion on Pentecost. The words are most beautiful highlighting the mysterious and glorious Advocate sent to us by God through Jesus. The Advocate, the Spirit is the tie that binds us with cords that cannot be broken. The spirit is the wind that can change our mourning into dancing.

Come, Holy Spirit, Come! Blow in, among, around and through us. Love,
