Love Letter from Your Pastor: The Wisdom of a Wrinkle
"You are beautifully and wonderfully made." Psalm 139:14

The meeting was called to order by Gloria Apple, a quorum was established, and all were welcomed. Lighting of the Christ Candle

A devotional prayer was provided by Gloria Apple to begin the meeting.

We Celebrate our Past

Approval of Minutes:

A motion was made by Dora Moore and seconded by Lisa Sinclair to approve the minutes from the June 2025 consistory meeting. No meeting was held in July. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report:

July 2025 Consolidated Fund Activity Report showed an ending balance of \$172,064.50 with total receipts of \$20,227.33 and total disbursements of \$25,421.81 reported. The General Fund end balance was \$6,947.61 with receipts of \$14,981.46 and disbursements of \$21,886.72. A motion was made by Don Kirkman and seconded by Dave Blakesley to approve the report. Motion carried. Information regarding the Miscellaneous Giving Fund and past transactions within the fund was provided.

Pastor's Report

Pastor Kristin expressed appreciation for her recent vacation time. She also reported on a request for Baptism for Tatum Reece, son of Brittany Reece and grandson of Wesley Reece. Additionally, a possible second baptism request for Bellamy Brown, child of Chelsea and Josh Brown was presented. Don Kirkman made the motion to accept both requests and Tammy Holt seconded. Motion passed.

Upcoming events include chicken pie fundraiser on August 23rd, and Worship at the Lake (with a presentation by the Food Ministry Task Force) on August 24th. Crop Walk is scheduled for the 2nd Sunday in October and we are in need of a leader for this event. World Communion will be on Sunday October 5th and Pastor Kristin requested that anyone on consistory that cannot participate in serving to our homebound members, please let her know.

A couple of areas for grants to support the work of the church are in process. WNCA accepts requests for grants aimed at growing ministries within UCC churches in the conference. An application is being submitted for \$1500 to support the Food Ministry work at Mt. Hope. Additionally, quotes to determine amounts needed for church repairs and improvements are being collected. These will be used in applications for possible large grant opportunities to address maintenance issues such as roof repair, moisture problems in basement, replacement of windows, repair of columns in front of church, or improvements such as installation of an elevator. This is work to prepare for possible funding, no identified resources are known yet.

The intent is to gauge the interest of the congregation and willingness to participate and volunteer. The Task Force will revisit the possibilities after the congregation's input.

Prayer of Intercession

Pastor Kristin offered prayers for those in need in the church and the surrounding community including those healing from injuries, illnesses and infections, those who have experienced burn injuries, death of a loved one, and those dealing with the stress associated with caregiving.

Old Business
