Pastor's Note



A Word from Your Pastor:

Ms. Shepherd sat in the open lobby of the cancer center, where I served as Chaplain for a number of years, every day waiting on her ride. She was usually cold, even in the heat of the summer. Treatments will do that to a body. Sometimes I would find her with her eyes closed and her head at rest catching her a little cat nap, but usually I found her alert and oriented, smiling at each person who came close to her wheelchair and saying, "Thank you, God" for even the tiniest of gestures. One day I noticed that she was dabbing at her dripping nose with the no-longer-warm blanket the radiation technician had given her to keep her warm while in our care. When I took her a few tissues and placed them in her hands, she looked up at me with her newly bald head and kind eyes, "Thank you," directing her words to me and then, "Thank you, Jesus," directing her words to the one who always kept her close and saw to it that all her needs were met.

If you asked Ms. Shepherd if she needed anything, she would tell you, "No." Yet, through the months of getting to know her as her Chaplain and part of her Care Team, we learned that she didn't have anything to speak of outside of the clothes on her back, the faith in her heart and the peace in her mind, but I never heard her ask for anything. She was much more content than most of our other patients. So, I asked her one day how her heart was so full of praise when she had so little. She looked into my eyes and said, "God is so good to me. How could I not praise his name?"

Scientists studied the resilience of sixteen societies worldwide, including the Yukon and the Australian Outback. They analyzed thousands of years of archaeological records, tracing the impact of famines, wars, and climate. One factor stood out from these 16 societies that made their resiliency sturdier than anyone else. The frequency of downturns. The more troubles the society had encountered together, the more resilient they had become. Societies that faced frequent hardships developed a resiliency—the ability to bounce back faster in the future. Habakkuk 3:17 speaks of pending hardship for God's people: "Though the fig tree does not bud and there are no grapes on the vines, though the olive crop fails and the fields produce no food, yet I will rejoice in the Lord and I will be joyful in God my Savior. God is my strength." The prophet's joy wasn't tied to earthly circumstances but anchored in God's unchanging character and salvation. In the bleakest of seasons, the prophet chose joy and became more resilient.

As we wrap up the last year and begin anew, may we find resilience, using what has been to be our foothold into the future. May we use what has already been to help us fall forward into a year where all we can do, no matter what happens, is praise God and rejoice in God, our Savior.

May God be your strength. May you be a light.

Thank you, Ms. Shepherd, for the reminder that what we really have cannot be seen with the eye, but felt in the depths of our hearts. Praise be to God!

The meeting was called to order by Gloria Apple, a quorum was established, and all were welcomed.

Approval of Minutes:

A motion was made by Tammy Holt and seconded by Cheryl Royal and Cindy McGee to approve the minutes from the October 2025 consistory meeting and the November 9, 2025 congregational meeting. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report:

October 2025 Consolidated Fund Activity Report showed an ending balance of \$174,277.49 with total receipts of \$20,550.80 and total disbursements of \$23,084.5 reported. The General Fund end balance was \$3,252.87 with receipts of \$19,990.45 and disbursements of \$23,229.03. A motion was made by Cheryl Royal and seconded by Cindy McGee to approve the report. Motion carried. Discussion was held regarding potential use of interest earned as needed, and follow-up on investment of leftover Steeple funds as planned.

Pastor's Report

There have been two deaths in the church this month, Linda Neese and Cindy Hamlett. There are also many pastoral care concerns at the present.

Congregational meeting was held during November and the conversation regarding the issues voted on was found helpful. A Thanksgiving Meal will once again be provided to residents of Alamance Plaza. Lisa Moser and the Board of Education are again coordinating this year's meal.

Upcoming events include the Church decorating on Monday November 24 at 6:00pm, the first Sunday of Advent on November 30, the Blue Christmas Service on December 18 at 6:30pm in the OFH, and the Candlelight Christmas Eve Service on December 24 at 7:00pm. Tammy Martin has agreed to lead the Board of Christian Education during Susan Finley's absence until the end of the year. The recent Trunk or Treat event sponsored by the Bd of Christian Education held at the church was a great success with families from the church and community attending.

Pastor Kristin reported that she will be working for a short time period as an Adjunct Professor at Catawba College. This will entail limited time of two Tuesdays a month and is part of an exchange for guest speaker time later on.
