# Pastor's Note

A Love Letter from your Pastor: Taking Sabbath Rest Seriously"

"Daniel pauses to sip his tea," Julia Cameron writes in her book, The Listening Path: The Creative Art of Attention. "His brow is creased in concentration. He asks me, "Does anybody listen anymore? Too often, people are listening to push their own agenda. True listening requires you to tune in, surrender your agenda, really understand what the other person is thinking, really listen to what is in their heart." I had this book sitting on my shelf, a gift given to me by a dear friend, when I received my star word at church this year, "Attention." I give my attention to so many things. Maybe this word wasn't for me. Then I remembered the story of my own daughter having to call me "Kristin" to get my attention from the crowd that gathered after worship when she was 4. Giving attention to something, listening, is a very intricate assignment if done with integrity. Here are a few quotations from all walks of life that have helped me begin to understand what the Magi brought me and what my dear friend already knew I needed.


