Pastor's Mote



The summer brings about another kind of rhythm. At least for my family the pace of school schedules and homework have been put to bed for a bit and the summer sun brings about longer days to be outside, put our hands in the dirt to grow a garden and celebrate the day's journey with s'mores by the firepit. What does the summer bring to you? What kind of schedule do you have? Is it different than normal? Is it a welcome change?

In his book Margin, Dr. Richard Swenson writes, "We must have some room to breathe. We need freedom to think and permission to heal. Our relationships are being starved to death by velocity---our children lay wounded on the ground, run over by our high-speed good intentions". Doesn't God promise to lead us beside the still waters, not the roaring rapids of the white-capped river? Swenson says we need some quiet, fertile "land" in life where we can rest in God and meet with our Creator.

Exodus 33:7 tells us that Moses used to take a tent and pitch it outside the camp some distance away, calling it the "tent of meeting." Anyone inquiring of the Lord would go to the tent of meeting outside the camp. And whenever Moses went out to the tent, all the people rose and stood at the entrances to their tents watching Moses until he entered the tent. The Lord would speak to Moses face to face, as one speaks to a friend. Moses and others like Abraham and Joshua and Elisha as well as Jesus and the disciples used to steal away and pray. Jesus would "often withdraw to a lonely place and pray."

During Covid when every square inch of our house was being used, by our family of 5, for us to work from home, zoom into meetings, or be online for school, my spirit ached for a quiet place to steal away to Jesus, or just to be with my own thoughts for a few minutes. By circumstance, I ended up pitching my tent of meetings on the trampoline in the back yard. Sometimes I used it for exercise, an afternoon nap, to read a book, to read the scriptures and spend intentional time being quiet and listening to God. No matter the experience, the time in the tent was holy. It was wide open space in the presence of God. I always emerged from the zipped mesh enclosure of a tent refreshed, grounded in God's presence. Aside from the dinner table, my newly pitched tent of meeting became a sacred and hallowed ground for my soul. Funny thing, now that Covid is over, it is still very important to me for all the same reasons.

Do you have a place that you can call "the tent of meeting?" A spacious place, that is not cluttered, where you can spend time with God every time you go there? Let's seek God in open spaces today. How will you build some space into your day to spend time with God?

NATIONAL MINORITY MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS MONTH is observed each July to bring awareness to the unique struggles that racial and ethnic minority communities face regarding mental illness.

African American, Native American Indian, Hispanic, Asian and Pacific Islanders are more likely to be depressed and have higher rates of anxiety. They often suffer from poor outcomes due to cultural stigma, discrimination, and lack of access to mental health care. **More diverse mental health counselors** familiar with racial, cultural and ethnic experiences, and family value are needed to better help minorities with their mental health challenges.

As we move forward in our **WISE for Mental Health j**ourney let's reflect on **what we can do as a church** to reduce mental health stigma.

The meeting was called to order by Dallas Belvin, a quorum was established and all were welcomed. Lighting of the Christ Candle

Jim Turner opened the meeting with a devotional highlighting the importance of avoiding becoming bogged down by daily chores and instead focusing on the future.

We Celebrate our Past

Approval of Minutes:

A motion was made by Tammy Holt to approve the minutes from the April 13, 2023 consistory meeting and Don Kirkman seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report:

April 2023 financial report was presented with an ending balance of \$177,259.74. Consolidated Fund receipts of \$22,352.45 and Disbursements of \$37,977.41 were reported. It was noted that this month's expenses reflected both the regular 2nd quarter insurance and the 1st quarter OCWM costs for the Southern Conference which inflated it somewhat. Steve Greeson made the motion to accept the April report and Tammy Holt seconded. Motion carried.

Additionally, a motion was made by Simon Clark and seconded by Jim Turner to use money from the General Fund to zero out the current negative balance showing on the Board of Christian Education Fund. Motion was carried. Simon Clark will explore the best way to prevent this from occurring in the future and present options later.

Pastor's Report

Pastor's report reflected one wedding occurring this past month and one new member request from Nancy Smith to join on Pentecost Sunday, May 28th. Tammy Holt made the motion to accept Nancy Smith's request for a letter of transfer and Don Kirkman seconded. Motion carried.

Plans are still underway for burying the time capsule on Pentecost Sunday, 5/28/23 which will also be Graduation Sunday honoring all Mt. Hope UCC graduates.

Reflection on the WISE Town Hall meeting on 4/30/23 was held noting the benefits of hearing stories of those who have experienced mental health issues, as well as the good ideas presented during the Town Hall. There will be additional opportunities for the church to seek ways to incorporate the principles of being a WISE church in the future.

Pastor also noted the church's support for the Mt. Hope Ballfield, and the need for help in the concession stand on Thursday and Friday nights 6:00-8:00pm. Simon also shared the water bottles with Mt. Hope UCC website and "comma" provided to sponsored team.
