


Pastor's Mote



Waiting isn't so easy. It sounds easy at first, but I learned it takes more diligence and attention than I originally thought. I learned this in the airport. My flight was delayed and so I was in the airport way ahead of my flight's departure. With hours to go, I settled in with a bit of food my favorite book and my earbuds firmly in my ears piping in my travel playlist. Soon, my belly was satisfied and my eyes grew heavy from reading, so I rested my head on the wall, looked at my watch to see that I still had lots of time before my plane would start to board, and fell asleep. I was awaked to a phone call interrupting my good string of music. It was the airline desk attendant letting me know that my flight had already boarded and this was my final call. I grabbed my few belongings and rushed to the gate, disheveled to say the least and she said, "Where have you been." "I was waiting right over there," I said, as I pointed to the corner on the far side of the wall from her call station. We have been paging you overhead for 20 minutes. I took my licks from her distain and boarded the plane. On my way home, I made a mental note that waiting is an active assignment not a passive one. Opening of the Meeting:

The meeting was called to order by Gloria Apple, a quorum was established, and all were welcomed.

Lighting of the Christ Candle

We Celebrate our Past:

Approval of Minutes:

A motion was made by Tracy Buff & seconded by Tammy Holt to approve the minutes from the September 2025 consistory meeting. Motion carried.

Treasure Report:

September Consolidated Fund Activity Report showed an ending balance of \$176,412.38 with total receipts of \$22,562.65 & disbursements of \$19,177.36.

The general fund had a beginning balance of \$7,424.03 and receipts of \$16003.64 and disbursements of \$14,335.03 and an ending balance of \$9,092.64.

A motion was made by Tracy Buff to accept the treasurer's report as presented and Cheryl Royal. Motion carried.

Pastors Report:

World Communion was Sunday October 5th and 18 people outside of the church were delivered communion.

November 1st. will be trunk or treat in parking lot from 2-4p.m.

Discussions were made about Out of the Garden Project. This will require 6-10 volunteers, and church could make monthly financial contributions. The food

ministry task force wants to make a commitment for 12 months.

New Business:

2025 Congregational Meeting will be held on Sunday November 9th. Dora Moore presented the proposed budget from the finance committee to the consistory for Approval.

Concerns were expressed on our church's wider mission (OCWM) & presenting to the congregation an outline for the budget; to introduce the following change for the 10% tithes as follows:

National UCC 10%

Southern Conference 10%

WNCA 20%

Church World Services 10%

Local Agencies 10%

Community Food Ministry 40%

Our proposed local agency for 2026 is Mustard Seed Clinic and the Community

Food Ministry for 2026 is Out of the Garden Project will be presented to the $\,$

Our proposed change to the constitution from 12 Consistory Members to 10 will also be presented to the Congregation.

The need for new members for next year's Consistory and Trustees was discussed. Sharon Mims will rotate off Consistory and Sylvia Belvin declined to seek re-election. Gloria Apple, Tracy Buff, Cindy McGee and Cheryl Royal are all up for re-election. Stan Buff will also rotate off as Trustee.

Charge and Benediction Meeting adjourned.

Mt. Hope United Church of Christ Congregational Meeting 11/9/25

An announced congregational meeting was held on Sunday November 9,2025 for the purpose of presenting a proposed change to the Constitution, proposed slate of new deacons and trustees nominated for the upcoming year, and the proposal for the upcoming year's budget including a revised allocation for Our Church's Wider Mission giving (OCWM). Gloria Apple, Consistory President called the meeting to order, and a quorum was established. Information had been provided on previous Sundays regarding the budget and proposed OCWM allocation. Additionally, individuals nominated for positions of deacons had been presented on Sunday November 2, 2025, and the floor opened for nominations from the congregation. With no additional nominations received, Brenda Currie made the motion to close the nominations and Dora Moore seconded. Motion carried.

A proposal revision to the church Constitution was presented from the Consistory. Currently, the Consistory consists of twelve elected members. The proposal was to reduce this number to ten elected members to address the complexity of finding enough members willing to serve. Motion to accept was made by Cole Levens and seconded by Stan Buff. Motion carried.

Dona Branson and Dallas Belvin were nominated for open positions on the Consistory due to the completion of four years of service by Sharon Mims who will be leaving Consistory, and the decision of Sylvia Belvin to not seek a second term. Gloria Apple, Tracy Buff, and Cheryl Royal were also nominated for a second term of two years. Cindy McGee who completed the unexpired term previously held by Bob Hamlet, was nominated for a new two-year term. Mike Johnson was nominated to fill the vacancy on Trustees left by Stan Buff's rotation off due to completion of six years. Brenda Currie made the motion to accept the nominated individuals for these positions and it was seconded by Lorie Arrington. The motion carried.

Simon Clark, Treasurer, presented the proposed 2026 budget and reviewed changes for the upcoming year. Included was the proposal to reallocate quarterly tithe payments made to OCWM. Historically, 100% of the payment has gone to the National UCC without input from the church on its use. In order to better meet the call for our church to address the needs of those around us and in the wider world, the proposal calls for the quarterly tithe payments to be allocated as follows: 10% National UCC, 10% Southern Conference, 20% Western NC Conference, 10% world missions, 10% local agencies, 40% community food ministries. Joe Hughes made the motion to accept the budget and proposal. Susan Finley seconded. The motion carried.

A proposal to use the quarterly tithe funds allocated for community food ministries to support Out of the Garden Project Mobile Market for the 2026 budget year was made. Bennie Gerner made the motion to accept the proposal and Ken Cham seconded. Motion passed. Additionally, a proposal to use the quarterly tithe funds allocated for support for local agencies go to Mustard Seed Community Health. Marcia Cham made the motion to accept the proposal and it was seconded by Melinda Kozak.

Ken Cham made the motion to dismiss and it was seconded by Joe Hughes. Motion carried and business was complete.
